



Good Neighbor Grant opportunities

This year, we've presented grants to the West Baton Rouge Parish Animal Shelter, the West Baton Rouge Parish Council and Brusly High School, just to name a few. Supporting Baton Rouge During COVID-19

The simple acts of washing your hands and using hand sanitizer can help slow the spread of diseases like COVID-19. In the midst of this global pandemic, access to chemicals used to manufacture disinfectants is critical. ExxonMobil's Baton Rouge Chemical Plant is helping to meet demand for products like medical-grade hand sanitizer, alcohol wipes and disinfectant sprays by maximizing production of a key ingredient, isopropyl alcohol (IPA). ExxonMobil produces IPA at the world's single largest unit located within the Baton Rouge Chemical Plant, and production was maximized to meet customer and societal needs.

ExxonMobil Gives Back To Local Organizations

In 2020, ExxonMobil joined Entergy Louisiana, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana Foundation, Humana and Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association Foundation to set up Fueling the Fight Fund at the Baton Rouge Area Foundation. Together they contributed nearly \$300,000 to the charitable account. ExxonMobil also supported local relief efforts by reimbursing the cost of fuel to Baton Rouge emergency response vehicles and providing gas gift cards to healthcare workers at Our Lady of the Lake, Baton Rouge General and Ochsner Health.

ExxonMobil Continues Sponsorship Of Local Firefighter Trainings In 2021

ExxonMobil Pipeline Company invites firefighters in the greater Baton Rouge area to participate in our pipeline emergency response training course provided at one of the world's top training facilities, the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service (TEEX) Brayton Fire Training Field.

ExxonMobil worked with TEEX to develop specialized firefighter training designed to teach how to manage pipeline and terminal facility emergencies. The company also funds the tuition and expenses for firefighters who attend, and to date, more than 250 firefighters have taken advantage of the opportunity.
